



Hautlieu 16+ Application 2022



Entry requirements

- English Language at 4 and four other GCSEs at 4/C grade (one of these could be GCSE Maths 4).
- A BTEC course will only account as the equivalent of one GCSE in a related subject at the appropriate level.
- Double GCSE awards with the exception of Science will only count as one subject.
- Where subjects have been previously studied at GCSE a minimum of a C is required to the same subject at A-Level or IB.
- Art, Theatre, Music and Music Technology entry will also be subject to audition / portfolio.

What can I study?

International Baccalaureate Diploma (IBDP)

Yr12 & 13

IBDP students study 6 subjects and follow a core programme

CORE

- Theory of Knowledge
- Creativity, Action & Service
- Extended Essay

There is internal assessment coursework in all subjects (20-50% of total) final exams are taken in May of Yr13

A Level

Y12 & 13

Students following an A level programme will typically study three subjects and take part in the Hautlieu HELP programme.

Some students might take an extra subject in Y12 such as retake Maths or level 3 Maths. These subjects are only one year courses.

Final exams are in May and June of Y13


International Baccalaureate Career Programme

Yr12 & 13

IBCP students study a minimum of 2 subjects and follow a core programme and IA

Assessment occurs in chosen subjects as with IBDP students (20%-30% coursework in each subject with final examinations in May of Year 13

In addition students will follow a professional L3 vocational programme in finance

- 3 subjects At Standard Level (SL)
- 3 at Higher Level (HL)
- Group 1 English
- Group 2 French, Spanish (and Spanish *beginners*), & Italian (*beginners*)
- Group 3 History, Philosophy, Psychology, Economics
- Group 4 Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Environmental Systems, Sport Science
- Group 5 Maths(Higher), Maths(Standard), (Applications and Interpretations)
- Group 6 Art or an additional “elective” subject from group 2,3 or 4
- Further subjects may be on offer e.g. Geography (Group 3), Des Tech (Group 4) subject to demand

IB Careers Programme

- 1. Minimum 2 DP subjects at Higher Level (HL)
 - 2. A Vocational subject – currently a finance qualification
 - 3. IBCP Core Language development (may be non examined or DP subject)
 - Service Learning
 - Personal and Professional skills
 - Reflective project
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- The 3 elements can be flexibly combined into a number of pathways. This may lead to work, apprenticeship or University. The Hautlieu programme will be delivered in conjunction with Deloitte LLP and will suit those wishing to pursue a career in the finance industry


Linear Programmes

- The IB programmes have always been 2 year courses with no external exams at the end of Y12.
- Hautlieu is currently in its first year of offering 2 year linear A level courses.
- This means that there are no AS exams at the end of Y12.
- All content assessed at end of course
- Less / No practical assessment on A level courses
- IB courses still have coursework
