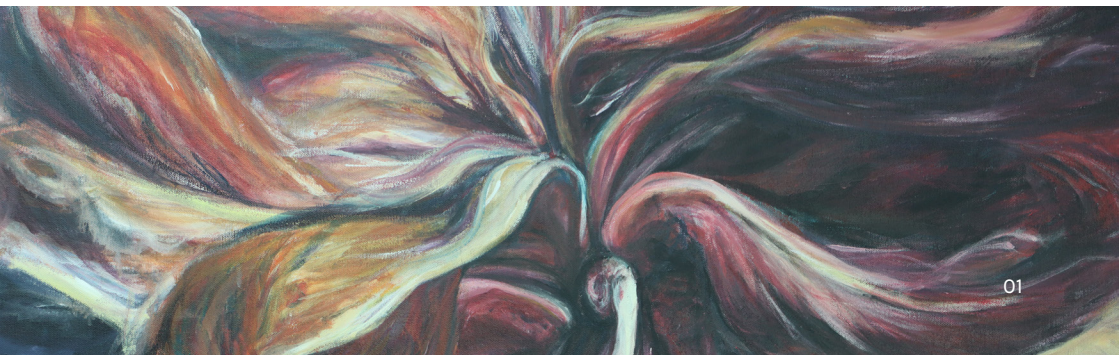

Music Award

The Music Award is sponsored by the Hutchinson Family. This award is given to the young person who has shown an exceptional love of music.

The word love is used purposefully, as music, like many arts, grows and achieves and succeeds most when it is performed with feeling and emotion. The love of music may be shown in many ways – in performing with feeling, in composing from the heart, in writing and understanding the music of others. This award is not just about technical brilliance in performing a piece (although that may be part of it) it's about being able to communicate that music to others.

It may be that the student who receives this award can demonstrate how music has changed or enriched their lives or that the performance or understanding of music has helped others. It may be that it has helped to build teamwork in the performance of a group piece or leadership with writing and ensuring their work is represented properly. So, the award is about how music has the potential to be a positive influence regardless of the type/form of music that is favoured by the student.

Philosophy Award

Marion Rushton was the Head of Religious Studies and Philosophy at Rouge Bouillon Girls School from 1954 and was one of the teachers who then transferred to Hautlieu School in the 1960's when girls were admitted to Hautlieu for the first time. She served as a dedicated teacher until 1978. This award is presented to the student who applies the main principles of philosophical enquiry to their work. The student will have displayed a passion for academic research leading to logical deduction and informed conclusions arising from their work.

Performing Arts - Spotlight Award

The Spotlight Award goes to the student who, throughout their time at Hautlieu, has made the greatest contribution to the theatrical life of the school. This student will have demonstrated enthusiasm, commitment, reliability and leadership and have taken significant responsibility for producing, directing, managing or performing in school based theatrical events.

This might include any or all of the following:

- Managing the tech crew for presentations and assemblies.
- Producing or directing a school show.
- Playing a major role in a school production.
- Training and supporting younger students in developing theatrical or technical skills..

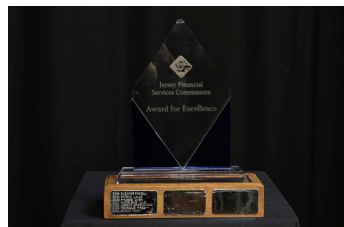
The Gerard Le Claire Environmental Award

The Gerard Le Claire Environmental Trust has offered the school an award in his memory to encourage our young people to follow his example and to protect our precious environment for future generations. Gerard Le Claire, former Head Boy, was tragically killed in a helicopter crash with a UN disaster relief team en-route to a natural disaster in Mongolia - he was aged 35.



The Jersey Financial Services Award

Initiated by Annette Cullen, Director of Human Resources, at the Commission, it was first awarded in 2010. The award is designed to recognise students who have consistently displayed excellence in areas such as leadership, organisation, co-operation, enterprise, and creativity - in other words qualities that would stand out to future employers.



The C. H. Brown Memorial Award

The C.H. Brown Award was originated in 1988 and each year members of staff are invited to nominate students who have made a significant contribution to the school or wider community. This award is in memory of the first headmaster of Hautlieu, Charlie Brown, and is given to the student who has made the most outstanding contribution to school and/or Island life.



The Le Bail Gad-Fly Award

The Le Bail Gad-Fly Award is awarded to the sixth student who has made the most effort to stimulate thought about controversial issues that the majority, including the school administration, might prefer to ignore.



School Awards

Hazel Romeril Award

Barry Romeril, former Head Boy and director of Xerox Corporation of USA has been most generous in his praise of the school and how it helped him (and his brother). He also recognises the tremendous support he received from his mother Hazel who had to cope with many difficulties when they were young. In memory of her tremendous endeavours, Barry has generously instituted an annual award for the school to be called the Hazel Romeril Award. The award is carved from two types of wood and is based on a seed to symbolise the growth and nurturing of young talent. The award will be given annually to the student who, quite simply, displays exceptional talent.



The Jack Worrall International Ambassador Award

The Jack Worrall International Ambassador Award is presented in memory of Jack Worrall, Hautlieu's second head teacher from 1976 to 1988. Jack Worrall was a multi-talented academic with wide interests in the arts, sciences and sport. He was a compassionate man with a deep desire to encourage and support young people to achieve the highest level. Having spent many years teaching overseas he had an acute understanding of what makes education a force to unite people, nations and cultures for peace and a sustainable future.



This award is presented to the student who shares his sense of idealism for a more peaceful and equitable world, someone who has promoted goodwill and collaboration between people from different cultures and has shown the benefits of fostering international cooperation and promoting intercultural understanding.

The Jack Brown Award is in recognition of a former Hautlieu student, Jack Brown, who despite suffering serious medical issues had the ability to overcome these through his amazing determination and dedication. This award is in recognition of all of his achievements.
