

Mentor Programme

- Key to building community within Hautlieu
- Each students' mentor is their first point of contact within Hautlieu
- Opportunity to build a positive professional relationship
- Each week will be made up of:
 - A year group assembly
 - An activity aimed to improve students' experiences at Hautlieu
 - A weekly team building quiz
 - A whole school assembly
 - A weekly activity aimed at improving academic outcomes

Dress Code

 Hautlieu dress code should be smart attire appropriate for a working environment and safe (specifically Sciences, DT etc)

- Some examples of unsuitable attire:
 - Flip flops
 - Nose rings
 - Outdoor clothing, worn inside
 - Clothing of inappropriate length
 - Inappropriate slogans
 - Shorts appropriate length









Expectations

- All Year 12 Students attend mentor time (8:35am) each day
- Students attend all lessons throughout their time at Hautlieu
- No more subject changes following tomorrow
- Students use their self-directed time to complete extra study for their subjects (guided at 5 hours per subject per week)
- Students follow the 6th form dress code and wear a visible lanyard at all times





Access to School Site

- For school drop off accessed from Bon Air Lane drop off is to be on the road adjacent to the school only. At no time must the spaces in Oakfield be used
- For school pick up accessed from Bon Air Lane collection is on the road adjacent to the school. Please do not block the access for the school buses
- It may be easier to arrange drop off and collection away from the school premises
- Car parking at Oakfield is split between Active Sports users and Hautlieu Year 13 students – there are strictly 40 permits for Year 13 students
- There is no parking available for student cars in Year 12

Moped / motorbike parking is available in designated areas alongside the JET building





The school day

• Students are required to be in school for the **entire school day**; 8.35am until 3.20pm (and after this, if homework is outstanding). Study periods are for independent study in school, with students able to work in the Learning Resource Centre or other suitable area of the school.

Attendance

- Attendance plays a key part in the success of students at 16+
- All absences should be reported to the office using the email office@hautlieu.sch.je
- Mr John monitors the attendance of Year 12 students and will look at interventions where needed.
- You can access attendance data using Go4Schools.
 Instructions for doing this can be found on the school website
- Holidays school term dates are published on the Government of Jersey Website – please do not book holidays during term time





What to do if your child is unable to attend a lesson

- A parent / guardian must contact the school office
- If we are not notified by a parent it is recorded as unauthorised
- *Family holidays are regarded as unauthorised absence by CYPES*
- If students become ill during the school day, then sign out at the office
- Do not arrange driving lessons / paid work during lesson time
 - We will authorise an absence for a driving test as long as we are notified by a parent

Current Process

Attendance reviewed fortnightly – each student individually reviewed Attendance falls below 90%

Stage 1 Review student and parents get an email notifying poor attendance (unless there is a genuine case of illness or other authorised absence)

Stage 2 Review student and parents get an email notifying poor attendance (unless there is a genuine case of illness or other authorised absence)

Stage 3 Review - Attendance Concern Meeting between a member of the Senior Leadership Team, students and their parents.

If poor attendance continues meeting with parents to discuss whether Hautlieu is the right place





Mentor Time – Why is full attendance necessary?

- It starts the day in a calm manner, settling the students for their first lesson
- Knowing your child's mentor they will be writing university references. It is a session towards attendance, just as any lesson would be.

Homework

- Will be issued using ShowMyHomework (Satchel One)
- Students will be able to see all of the homework that they have been set alongside any upcoming assessments etc
- Parents are able to use the student's pin (found on their account) to monitor homework



Study Skills

- Lots of skills will be discussed throughout the second half term
- We will be focusing on techniques designed to improve productivity, enable better note taking and develop exam technique and confidence
- Links to these techniques will be on SharePoint for students to access once the delivery has taken place

Exams

- Throughout students' time at Hautlieu they will have a number of assessments and exams within their subjects.
- Whilst each subject has key features to its assessments all Year 12 students will complete end of year exams.
- Year 12 students are expected to achieve a grade D or above in their subjects during these exams.
- These will take place during the following weeks:





Supporting Students throughout Exams

- Work with your child to find what revision style works for them.
- Encourage your child to take revision breaks and find a balance between studying and doing things they find enjoyable and relaxing.
- Make sure they are eating and drinking at regular intervals.
- Encourage them to take some time after revising to wind down.
- Reassure them reinforce that you are and will be proud of them no matter what happens.
- Remain positive and hopeful!
- Plan a treat or an activity together to mark the end of the exams.

Set aside one to one time so that they can talk to you about any worries.

Let them know their feelings are valid and normal, but also offer support and solutions where possible.

Anxiety is often worst at night and this means it is useful to encourage a good bedtime routine.

Work with them to develop relaxation techniques.

If anxiety and stress start impacting their dayto-day life, seek help from your GP. Work with your child to find what revision style works for them.
